'I have 50% visual impairment and since joining Sarthak, my life has taken a new direction. I've developed practical skills, self-confidence, and a real sense of purpose. This experience is shaping my future and giving me hope.'

Early Intervention Update

The Early Intervention Program at SGRC continues to create meaningful change in the lives of children and families. This month, we celebrate the journey of **Harsh Kashyap (age 9)**.

When Harsh arrived, he struggled with high sensory sensitivity and rapid, unclear speech. Through consistent sensory play, occupational and speech therapy, he has shown remarkable improvement. Harsh now self-regulates using safe sensory strategies, understands social boundaries, and speaks more clearly with a reduced speech rate. His story is a powerful reminder of how timely support and empathy can unlock potential.

Visitor Feedback Trends

Feedback this month was overwhelmingly positive. Visitors described their experience as a 'lifetime memory,' 'eye-opening,' 'well-organised,' and 'truly impactful.'

Many shared how the visit challenged their perceptions of disability and inspired them to become more inclusive in their personal and professional spaces.
