Advocacy for Sarthak means to take action to create change. Advocacy has been described as "speaking truth to power". The perennial struggle of the rights of people with disability, including the right to have access to public resources, right to education, right to be employed, and other community support services necessary to support living an independent, unsegregated life is advocated through advocacy programs of Sarthak. Sarthak Educational Trust takes pride in mentioning that more than 200+ corporate houses have been sensitized and converted into the prospective hiring partners of persons with disability.

Levels of Advocacy at Sarthak

 With Government - As an outcome of advocacy with center and state government of India, Sarthak advocacy events came with varied thought leadership over various areas of action for PwDs, namely, National Action Plan Accessibility India Campaign, Sector Skill Council for Persons with Disabilities, and passing of the Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016 was the positive outcome.

Glimpses of Sarthak's interaction with Telangana Government

Telangana government recently reached out to Sarthak on 19th feb 21 for special employment program for persons with disability. They also appreciated the Capsarathi app which is an app built by a joint initiative of Capgemini and Sarthak. This enables people to gather all the information from one platform.

• With Corporate —We envision a society of humankind to be stronger. This is also done where we involve the corporate stakeholders, study job profiles with person with






disabilities with the mutual consent of the human resource manager. Not only this, a basic orientation session is conducted for the non –disabled employees of the organization to acquaint them with the basic know – how to deal with the persons with disabilities, for instance, sign language sessions, basic infra support for accessibility at workplace etc.

Sensitization Workshops

Sensitization for them becomes an important agenda in inclusive hiring initiatives. Once they are sensitized and understand the value proposition with the PwD, it leads to successful inclusion and long-term benefits to them producing diverse and strong teams.

With this approach Sarthak had an opportunity to present sensitization workshops "Haath se baat" on 10thFebruary 2021 with 60 Infosys employees and with Reliance Retail on 11thFebruary, which made people come closer to understanding disability.






Sarthak with Reliance Retail


RDSM online session on the topic for the session was "Introduction to CapSarathi (Mobile app). This app is a platform for the PwDs where they can access all the disability related information.

In 2013, Shahdab got recruited in **IBM as a Senior Practioner**, in the finance department. He identifies the struggles that comes along disability but embraces it and urges others also to do the same.

Asif was born in a small village in Bihar. He is an **OH Candidate**. His parents have reached out to provide him the best education. Never in life has his father compromised his education. Even after completing his education from a reputed engineering college the job prospects were reduced to nil because of his disability and the stereotypes revolving around the same. During his struggle days he **reached out to Sarthak** for training and employability.

Sarthak helped him with solution solving, communications and honed his computer skills. He worked in rhythm with Sarthak and secured a position in **Global logic as a Senior Analyst** and envisions a society where persons with disability are enthused with vigor to do great things in life.

Vijay Sharma – Sarthak Ghaziabad Center

People with disabilities are much more likely to experience material hardships such as food insecurity, inability to pay rent, mortgage and utilities or not being able to get needed medical care than people with disabilities at the same income levels. The intersection of disability and poverty is too rarely discussed. Poverty with disability has been the two major challenges for Vijay Sharma who hails from Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh and has 44% locomotive disability. With utmost difficulty, Vijay completed his 12th and transitioned to Delhi for his health treatments and with most income gone in treatment, he then realized how important it is to work and be financially independent. He soon came to know about Sarthak and was affirmative to join the 3-month free of cost training program.

The target specific training at Sarthak gave a comprehensive lens to Vijay. He together with Sarthak trainers honed his communication, computer and English skills. After the successful completion of his course, Sarthak Educational Trust helped him get recruited in the biggest retail company named, Marks and Spencer as a Store Operator. He truly believes that people are not physically disabled as long as they are determined to take big leaps.

Vijay urges for people with disability that one should face challenges and not run away from that. Sarthak for him was a platform that made him embrace his disability.

Jyoti Singh – Sarthak Lucknow Center

Ms. Jyoti Singh is an **OH candidate**. Life with disability has been extremely challenging for her. Having completed her 10th standard, her parents got her married. She wasn't able to comprehend her life and its values, as paralysis in both legs restricted her mobility and orientation. Jyoti was determined to study more as education helped her transport from one part to the other.

It was her encounter with Sarthak that she was able to recollect her skills. With Sarthak's trainers, Jyoti even fastened her typing skills and overcame all her inhibitions. **Sarthak's 3 month free of cost** training program helped her get recruited in **108 call center as a call operator**, where she helps people who need assistance.

Nagraju - Sarthak Vishakhapatnam Center

Its rightly said, if you can dream it, you can achieve it. Born and brought up in a poor family, Nagraju transitioned to Hyderabad to help his family financially. Little did he know that the train accident on the way back home after 2 years would change his life. In 2010, Nagraju lost his legs and right hand in a train accident. He was declared dead by the doctors in the village but with God's grace, Nagraju regained consciousness and was brought to life. It was a life-threatening period from 2010-2015 for him as he was bed ridden. After years of struggle and emotional turmoil, Nagraju went on to pursue his education.

He was facing isolation from the society because of his disability, until he met Sarthak. With the help of Sarthak's 3 month free of cost training program, Nagraju learnt the basic principles of communication, correct usage of English and computers. It became a silver lining for Nagraju as he regained confidence in self. Nagraju is currently working in Millennium solutions as a Mobilizer and also gives motivational speeches to the underprivileged. He extends his gratitude to Sarthak for giving him such a life changing opportunity and that now he is providing able people with job opportunities.
